1. Definitions

In this scheme:

“the charity” means the charity identified at the beginning of this scheme.

“the Commission” means the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

“existing governing document” means the Scheme dated 24 July 1970.

ADMINISTRATION

2. Administration

The charity is to be administered in accordance with its existing governing document as altered or affected by this scheme.

3. Alteration of existing governing document

The existing governing document will take effect with the following amendments:

The following wording added to clause 33:

“If and in the event that there are funds surplus to the reasonable requirements of the Almshouse Branch the Trustees may (but shall not be required to) release the same or part thereof for the benefit of the Relief in Need Branch”

Clause 35 deleted and replaced with the following clause:

“35. Qualifications of almspeople – The almspeople shall be persons in conditions of need, hardship or distress living within the City of Cambridge and its surrounding area, or who can otherwise establish a personal connection with the said area.”

Clause 51(1) deleted and replaced with the following clause:

“51. Relief in need. – (1) The Trustees shall apply the income of the Relief in Need Branch in relieving either generally or individually persons in conditions of need, hardship or distress living within the City of Cambridge and its surrounding area, or persons in conditions of need, hardship or distress who can otherwise establish a personal connection with the said area, by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons.”

GENERAL PROVISION

4. Questions relating to the Scheme

The Commission may decide any question put to it concerning:

- (1) the interpretation of this scheme; or
- (2) the propriety or validity of anything done or intended to be done under it.
